The Investigations and Evidence Management (IEM) programme is designed for both professional and qualified investigators to validate and enhance pre-existing knowledge and skills and to ensure a consistent organisational approach to investigations - but as importantly - it is also designed to enable those leading or participating in an investigation (who have no prior training, qualifications, or experience) to actively manage or support an investigation. The objective of the course is to support effective and legally compliant processes to ensure a professional and legal investigation is conducted - and that any findings are admissible in a criminal prosecution or employment or contract termination procedure.

Safe Driver Training

The Safe Driver Training (SDT) programme addresses the core areas of safe vehicle operations for international and domestic (host nation) drivers in order to reduce risky behaviours and road traffic accidents impacting people, property, and livestock. The programme also includes a security module for areas where crime, banditry, and terrorism exists; as well as a motorcycle module for those operating two wheeled vehicles. The programme can be adopted as a multi-learner programme, offering a career development pathway as individuals grow personally and professionally; or it can be used to address specific bands or areas of technical knowledge.
